HAVE YOU EVER been in a position where, after committing a sin that was hurtful to another, you were put on public display because of it—and then were stunned to receive forgiveness instead of punishment?

The scribes and Pharisees have brought to Jesus a woman who was caught in the act of the worse kind of sin imaginable. The scene centres around her and the story ends with her. However, there is another trial taking place: that of Jesus and his interpretation of the law. The woman is being objectified , used as a way of entrapping Jesus. What will Jesus do? What will Jesus say? Instead of saying something that might contradict Moses and the law, Jesus pushes the onlookers to consider their own sins with the same level of gravity as the woman's. All leave Jesus' presence escaping condemnation. The woman is blessed with Jesus' tender response of "Neither do I condemn you. Go your way, and from now on do not sin again." Jesus does not condemn us; therefore we do not need to condemn ourselves.

Our Lenten journey each year draws us closer to Christ, with the challenge of growing in mercy towards ourselves and others. In what ways do we act like the woman? Like the scribes and Pharisees? And in what ways are we like Jesus, living mercy?

Readings:

1st Reading: Isaiah 43.16-21 2nd Reading: Philippians 3.8-14 Gospel: John 8. 1-11

The emphasis on newness from the first two readings today reaches a climax in Jesus' encounter with the woman caught in adultery. Jesus' response is typical, drawing out with razor sharpness what he considers core values in word and deed: holiness is found in compassion and understanding, reflecting the ways of God. There is no room here for judging others harshly while being lenient on oneself.

- Are you comfortable with Jesus' treatment of the woman?
- Who are you in the story: the woman, the Pharisees and scribes or Jesus?
- How does God's love sustain you even when you have sinned? (*Reflection: Diocese of Saskatoon*)

Saint of the Week—April 7 Saint John Baptist de la Salle

John Baptist de la Salle was the founder of the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, a teaching order well known in North America and around the world. John's great achievements began quite unexpectedly. Born in 1651 in France, he inherited the position and riches of his family. Destined for a successful career in the Church, he was ordained in 1678 and soon was asked to help establish some charity schools. He quickly realized that the teachers had to be trained and he provided housing for them, His desire to be in the same position as his teachers inspired him to resign his canonry and to give up his private fortune.

In 1684 the group became a religious community. Their rule stated that no brother could become a priest and no priest could join the order, a rule that has been preserved. Despite much opposition and hardship, by the time of his death in 1719, John Baptist had established the first teacher training college, schools for both the poor and the privileged, and written several education manuals, now classics in the field of education. He is a patron of teachers. *- Living with Christ, April 2025*
