PASSION (PALM) SUNDAY

The theme of the suffering servant prevails throughout the Gospel of Mark. Jesus does not desire to be known through miracles and healing. Instead, his true identity is revealed through his oneness with humanity, most profoundly witnessed in his relationship with the suffering and persecuted of the world. It is the cross that most blatantly reveals the death blowing consequences of our inability to set down selfcentered behaviors of destruction and live in right relationship of covenant life. Through the stark reality of the cross Jesus invites us to choose eternal life. With open arms he welcomes us to rise above the forces of death, in forgiveness and love, to follow him as disciples of life. 1. There are many characters in the passion account of Mark including: Pilate, Judas, the high priest, bystanders, women from a distance, the disciples and the centurion at foot of the cross to name but a few. Which of these characters do you identify with? Why? How do you think this identification might deepen your experience of Holy Week? 2. At the Last Supper Jesus offers his entire life, all of who he is, as the way of discipleship. He offers his life as the means to follow him into the fullness of right relationship with all of creation. How do you respond to this invitation? 3. After a triumphal entry into Jerusalem, Jesus is totally rejected and abandoned by everyone, even his closest friends. What has been your experience of failure, rejection or abandonment? 4. My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? When have you felt forsaken by God? What gives you hope? LIVING THE WORD Remember that Holy Week is an invitation to become a disciple of the Suffering Servant. Live

and act more consciously in the story that promises life!
